









GIRL CONFESSES SHOOTING AT OWLS CLUB

Declares Wounding of County Warden Was Accident—Both Drinking, She Says.

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The detective, unable to find either the girl or Mr. Raoul at the club-room, started a search. They located the girl and the secretary had slipped quietly from the back stairs half an hour after the shooting. As Raoul and Mrs. Hallius rushed across the sidewalk they started to enter the cab the detective accosted them and hurried across the street. They accosted the two.

According to reports told to Night Chief by Detective Waggoner, both Raoul and the woman were nervous when confronted by the officers. Raoul did not speak, they said, after they grasped his arm, but the woman "tumbled away from the detective who held her and faced them as they demanded:

"What do you want me for? 'didn't shoot him!"

The woman then tried to break away and enter the waiting cab, but the officers ordered her to go to head quarters with them. Raoul, too, went along.

The detective claim the utterance of the woman when they placed her under arrest was significant. Waggoner, who she asked why she was wanted, and whom she told she had shot about Captain Thompson.

At headquarters Friday night the woman answered the questions put to her by Chief Jett readily and completely, and emphatically denied that she had shot Captain Thompson. Her version of the affair, as told to chief Jett, is as follows:

Other Woman in Room. She has known Captain Thompson for some time, she declared, and Friday night had gone with him to the club. They entered the reception parlors of the club and took one of the tables. She claims she had drunk one glass of wine before the shooting.

It was, she said, while drinking wine and talking, but was not intoxicated. Two other men, seated at a table near the doorway, were the only other occupants of the room. One of them, she said, was a woman, and she said she had seen her at a party.

She said she was shot and saw him on the floor beside him. The two women near the door were talking by their table, and taking in horror the figure of the captain on the floor.

U. S. SETS SMOKE AND DRINK RECORD

Consumes 64,500,000 Barrels of Beer, 143,300,000 Gallons of Liquor, 7,707,000,000 Cigars.

WASHINGTON, July 5.—The American people drank more whiskey and beer, smoked more cigars and cigarettes, and chewed more tobacco during the fiscal year 1914 than in any other yearly period of the nation's history, according to estimates based today upon the record-breaking internal revenue receipts of the Federal Government for twelve months ended June 30.

The drinkers consumed 143,300,000 gallons of whiskey and brandy and 64,500,000 barrels of beer. Smokers puffed 7,707,000,000 cigars and 1,413,000,000 cigarettes. Patrons of the pipe smoked 632,000,000 pounds of tobacco and chewers of snuff disposed of \$2,800,000 pounds.

Despite the high record, the number of persons of the country decreased by 1,000 during the year. The retail liquor dealers numbering 141,000, and the number of salaried employees of the Federal Government 1,413,000.
