**The Intense Heat Waves Continue over  
a Greater Portion of the Country Today,  
being Excessive in Sections extending  
from the Great Lakes to the Gulf of Mexico  
and the South, and from the Atlantic Coast to  
the mountains of the West. The maximum  
heat recorded in the various sections of the  
country is 100 degrees or more, while the  
minimum is 70 degrees or less. The heat  
wave is now moving westward, and the  
maximum temperatures will be recorded  
in the West on Saturday.**

**Continuation of the Heat Waves  
Expected to Last at Least Two Weeks**

**Two Atlanta Men Prostrated by Heat**

**Two cases of heat prostration were re-  
ported in Atlanta during the unbroken
