According to Attorney William H. Coleman of Atlanta, except for the repeal of the military law of 1916, the officers would resign.

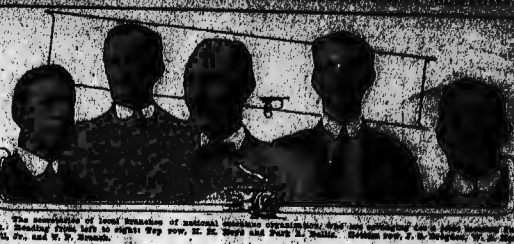
