UNCLE SAM IN MEXICO

Discussion at Washington Takes Turn of Popular Elections and Establishment of Constitutional Government

THIS SOLUTION, HOWEVER, NOT FAVORED BY REBELS

And Unless Both Factions Request It, United States Cannot Act—President Disapproves Further Discussion

WASHINGTON, July 24.—The discussion of the Mexican situation has turned toward proposals that the United States act as a mediator while elections are held and a constitutional government established. Although such suggestions have at various times been made to President Wilson Secretary Bryan and members of Congress by persons in Mexico and Central America, the United States has refused the suggestion because of its attitude of the constitutionalists that they would not entertain mediation under any circumstances. A solution of the Mexican situation is not favored by rebels. "We will guarantee the honesty of our elections," they guarantee we can have in the possession of the government by arms, just as a previous president and had elections when the country is divided. This is the attitude of the constitutionalists. This was the answer of the constitutional representative in Washington in order to report that mediation was about to be undertaken through the United States. The constitutionalists profess to need a neutral mediator in the part of the United States government to assure a suspension of hostilities and that it would take regulatory measures to prevent the rebels from using the constitutionalist point of view as a basis for proposals repeatedly made during the past few days.
