Four distinct features marked the trial of Leo M. Frank Wednesday. One was an admission from Miss Grace Hix, the state witness, that she frequently combed her hair over the machines in the metal room of the factory; another was a strenuous effort on the part of the state to prove that Frank was very nervous on the morning of the discovery of the murdered girl's body.

The state is expected to introduce as evidence several strands of hair found on the handle of a turning table in the metal room, and to show that the hair was of the same color and shade as that of the murdered girl.
