Atlanta, Aug. 11.—(Special to The Atlanta Journal-Constitution.)

In an eloquent speech, repeated with words of fire, and a scathing attack on the smug, self-satisfied, somewhat humorless, but at all times, dramatic, Attorney Frank A. Hooper, Thursday morning opened the state's argument for the conviction of Frank for the murder of Mary Phagan.

Mr. Hooper began his speech by denouncing the jury that was not seeking a verdict guilty unless the defendant was guilty, and that the state cheerfully would be held liable for any error.

He described the defendant as a "Jekyll and Hyde" man who was congenial with two widely different sets of associates.

Washington, D. C., Aug. 11.—The most important step in the case of United States Judge Henry H. Spear, of the South Georgia district, whose impeachment charges, will be a conference of the Georgia congressional delegation tomorrow morning.

Mr. Hooper's speech was when he said "the defendant the benefit of every doubt, the state will show that he either killed this little girl or sat there in the room and let the negro kill her and drag her body down the hall to the street and let it be carried while the Missouri Jew was in Frank's office."

Mr. Hooper reminded the jury that although Frank had sworn that he did not leave his office between 12 and 1 o'clock the girl never had gone there during that period and found the body.

Mr. Hooper touched upon the evidence only in a general way. He left the detailed argument to the collector Dorsey who will make the last argument.

At 11:15 o'clock Mr. Hooper concluded his argument, having spoken for two hours and ten minutes. For the next three minutes he registered his points upon which the state would request the court to charge the jury, giving special emphasis to what he considered "reasonable doubt."

At 11:45 o'clock Thursday morning the court adjourned and immediately after the argument started. Attorney Frank Hooper opened for the state, with ten business law books, for reference and citation during the course of his speech.

Deputy Sheriff Francis Miller addressed the audience and admonished it to preserve absolute order. The deputy instructed the audience that whether they were present or not, they were present in court.

### Battle to Death With Knives After Wednesday Night Prayer Meeting at New Hope Church

One Dead, Three Badly Stabbed in Clash in Moonlight at Church Door

Four men armed with pocket knives battled in the moonlight outside New Hope church, three miles from Marietta, after prayer meeting there Wednesday night, with the result that one is dead, another fatally wounded, and a third slain in the Cobb county jail on the charge of attempt to murder.

The dead man is George Loring, a youth about twenty-two years of age. T. McElroy, charged with the death, himself lies in his farm-house home two miles outside Marietta with five wounds in his body and small chance for recovery.

Fred Harper is the man in jail charged with attempting McElroy's life, and the young man for some time has trouble between the men as to the charge on account of McElroy's daughter, who was killed.

At the conclusion of the evening service McElroy and his daughter entered the church door. It is said that three of the youths had something about the girl as father and daughter entered there. McElroy reacted.

Three of them drew their knives and began to fight. The girl and children ran screaming back to the church. One of the youths was killed on Long before blood members of the congregation separated the combatants. Loring was lying dead on the ground.

### SENATE RESOLUTION WOULD PLACE TROOPS IN MEXICO AT ONCE

McKee Will Quit if Charge Is Withdrawn

Reported in Washington That Atlanta Postmaster Knows Charges Must Stick

Washington, Aug. 11.—Senator Foraker introduced today a resolution requiring President Wilson to take the necessary steps to place United States troops in Mexico to protect American lives and property; such a step to be taken by the senate on 10 o'clock on August 12.

The administration has asked for \$100,000 to take Americans out of Mexico, and Senator Foraker after announcing he would not discuss his resolution.
