## JUDGE ROAN'S SENTENCE OF FRANK TO DEATH

STATE OF GEORGIA, vs. LEO M. FRANK. Judgment of guilty, July term, 1918. Whereupon, it is considered, ordered and adjudged by the court that the said Leo M. Frank, shall be executed by the electric chair on the common jail of the county of Fulton, and that he be there safely kept until his final execution in the manner fixed by law.

It is further ordered and adjudged by the court that on the 10th day of October, 1936, the defendant, Leo M. Frank, shall be executed by the electric chair in private, witnessed only by the executing officers, and that the execution of such defendant shall not be deemed a public execution as he may desire; such execution to take place in the common jail of the county of Fulton, and that he be there safely kept until his final execution in the manner fixed by law.

A request will be written, however, in the higher courts, to the effect that Leo M. Frank, should be executed by the electric chair on the 10th day of October, 1936, in private, witnessed only by the executing officers, and that the execution of such defendant shall not be deemed a public execution as he may desire; such execution to take place in the common jail of the county of Fulton, and that he be there safely kept until his final execution in the manner fixed by law.

He discussed "reasonable doubt," declaring that the burden of proof that defendant is guilty beyond "a reasonable doubt, but not beyond all doubt" rests upon the state. He said that if good character were proven, it would not suffice.

He then defined the motion for a mistrial as a request for a new trial. He said that the presumption of innocence was in the defendant's favor until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.

The judge charged the jury that they were the sole judges of the credibility of witnesses. He outlined the legal meaning of "direct evidence" and "circumstantial evidence." He declared that evidence of good character on the part of the defendant was relevant and material.
