JUDGE ROAN'S SENTENCE OF FRANK TO DEATH

STATE OF GEORGIA, vs. LEO M. FRANK. Before the court, the defendant, Leo M. Frank, was sentenced to death by hanging on October 10, 1936. The verdict was rendered by a jury of twelve men who found Frank guilty of the murder of Mary Phagan.

It is further ordered and adjudge by the court that on the 10th day of October, 1936, the defendant, Leo M. Frank, shall be executed by the sheriff of Fulton County in private, witnessed only by the executing officer, the sheriff and the witnesses of such execution, and the execution shall be carried out as he may desire, such execution to take place at the place of execution for the state of Georgia, and the body of the defendant shall be disposed of as the board of prison directors may see fit.

A request will be written, however, in the higher courts, to the governor, unless Judge L. S. Roan grant their motion for a new trial. Attorneys for Frank will carry their fight to set aside the verdict and to have the case retried.
