**ROCHESTER, Dec. 30.**—In an address tonight before about 1,000 delegates to the Jewish Chautauqua Society Convention, Dr. Leon Harrison of St. Louis said:

“I do not know whether Leo Frank is innocent or guilty. I do not know whether he committed that heinous crime of which he has been accused. I do not know whether he deserves the fate which seems to be meted out for him. It may be said that he richly deserves the sentence which has been pronounced against him. But one thing I am certain of is, that Leo Frank has not received the fundamental right to which every American citizen under arrest is entitled, a fair trial. It only shows that the prejudice against the Jews has not been entirely removed. It only shows that the Jew is born to suffer. But will the State of Georgia dare to send a man to the gallows who has not received a square deal?”
