the introduction of the indeterminate sentence into the penal procedure of Georgia.

Chairman Davision, of the prison commission, who should be an authority on the
subject, recently appeared before the senate committee and enthusiatically recommonded the house. The bill as amended. ate committee and entaussatically recoun-mended the chance. The bill, as amended, abolishes the rigid maximum sentences now imposed under the Georgia law. It em-powers the court, in passing sentence for felony or offence of any nature coming un-der its provisions, itself to fix a minimum and maximum suiting the special case. In other words, the court may sentence a conother words, the court may sentence a couvicted burgiar to, for illustration, not less
than six months or a year and not more
than five, contingent on good behavior. If
at the end of the minimum fixed by the
judge the prisoner gives evidence of havins
reformed he can be released at the discretion of the proper authorities. At the end
of the maximum period fixed by the court
he is discharged automatically. The present law allows no such latitude. The judge
must be a right maximum regardless of the must fix a rigid maximum, regardless of the prisoner's chances of reformation before the expiration of that time, and the only intervention is by executive commutation

Hillsboroush county, Florida, of which Tampa is the county seat, has just voted \$1,000,000 in londs to build Hillsboroush's quota of the brick hishway which is to extend from Jacksonville to Tampa, a distance of 230 miles. The hishway is now assured, since all the intervening counties have acted and Hillsboroush puts on the finishing touch. The Associated Press notes significantly that "this is the largest bond issue for county roads in the south." The point is this: All the counties between Jacksonville and Tampa were induced to go lino the project because the route was the one logical southeastern terminus of all national highways.

The highway between Macon, a city of approximately 200,000 population, is less than one hundred miles. It is the one indispensable link in all highways not only north and south, but east and west as well. Interstate or intrastate highway traffic cannot well traverse Georgia from border to border without using this Macon and Atlanta stretch.

One would assume that, under these conditions, the counties intervening between these two places would be sufficiently awake to their interest to make this maintraveled boulaward as smooth as a floor. Certainly, if one Porida county could afford to spend, collectively, a less sum to put it in passable shape.

This would mean the destruction of many a girl—their loss for the want of a place in our state to handle delinquent girls; these cannot be put in the chaingang or with the women of the prison farm.

John Y. Smith, of Fulton, with C. F. Hollberg, of Coweta, saved the measure by suggesting that it lay over until this coming Thursday.

Chairman Wheatley agreed to this.

The Penitentiary Committee has recommended that this bill do pass.

The Prison Commission has said that Georgia today cannot take care of her wayward and delinquent girls.

Confidently, we believe that the Committee on Appropriations will recommend the passage of the bill, carrying the appropriation of \$30,000.00 (\$45,000.00 less than was asked for) to build the reformatory for

The need is urgent—far more so than the sickness of our hogs.


