

On that account it is of some importance, particularly in persons of high rank. I must now say that we do not wish to control your own taste and fancies, which, on the contrary, we wish you to indulge and develop, but we do expect that you will never wear anything extravagant or slang, not because we don't like it, but because it would prove a want of self-respect and be an offense against decency, leading—as it has often done before in others—to an indifference to what is morally wrong."



Dr. Carl Alsberg, the successor of the lamented "Old Dec Wiley," described how conflict between state and federal jurisdiction, and neglect by the states, jeopardized human welfare. Dr. Rudolph Hering, well known in Atlanta, said that the lack of a national health department and cabinet efficier cost this country countless lives annually, and that the day was not far distant when America would wake up to the fact.

Both speakers were correct. The states are still fealous of their rights in the matter of health conservation, save when some devastating plague, like yellow fever or the bubonio plague, makes its appearance. Then they are ready enough to go scurrying to the cover of the federal towerment.

There is no uniformity among the states in the enactment and enforcement of health legislation. Just how siting states can be in protecting their human assets is shown in the case of Georgia. Of what use to lavish millions on public buildings, on defenses, on pork and on other projects, when we make a farce of the whole thing by spending figurative hundreds on the health of the people who are to enloy these blessings, and whom we are going to protect from the enemy from without.
