That speaks in the emphatic majority of those actually voting, and it speaks even more decistively in the many thousands who regarded the new charter so lightly as to vote neither for or against it. With nearly twelve thousand voters registered and many municipal elections showing total balloting of from twelve to fifteen thousand, the total vote on the new charter ran only a trifle over 3.500.


