

Hon. Clyde II. Tavenner, House of Representatives, Washington, D. C.

My Dear Sir:
Did you write me a letter and make the letter public, asking me to submit all the Standard Oil letters that I have in my possession to the House Committee now investigating the charges of lobbying made by a certain Mulhall!

I would be very glad to submit again to the congressional committee or to any responsible body, the Standard Oil letters which I have already submitted many times to the public and to bodies which more or less accurately and sincerely represent the public.

I would prefer, however, not to submit these Standard Oil letters in connection with the Mulhall letters and charges for the simple reason that the Standard Oil letters are very important to the nation, very serious in their incriminations and wholly authoritative and genuine, while the Mulhall letters and documentary evidence have never appeared to me especially important or serious or genuine.


