GARRANZA REFUSES ALLIANCE WITH DIAZ

NASHVILLE'S DEATH RATE INCREASES DURING 1911

WASHINGTON, May 1.—Mortality statistics for 1911, as contained in an issue of the Bulletin of the United States Public Health Service, do not reflect credit upon the cities of Atlanta and Nashville. The bulletin shows that these cities had a slight increase in the death rate in 1911 compared with 1910. The death rate in Atlanta, having risen from 18.9 per 1,000 in 1910 to 19.4 per 1,000 in 1911. The increase in Nashville was even larger—from 18.7 in 1910 to 20.2 in 1911. New Orleans, which in 1911 was rated as an unhealthy city on the ground of its location, showed an improvement as indicated by the statistics.
