GRAND JURY READY TO INVESTIGATE CHARGES

Foreman Beck Slates Position, Probe Awaits Request From Chief Beavers

The Fulton county grand jury will investigate the Foster Beavers controversy at any of the interested parties ask an investigation, according to Foreman L. Beck.

Mr. Beck has not yet been approached by the matter by Chief J. L. Beavers, who has declared that he will ask a grand jury investigation of the charges made against him and his department by Colonel Thomas M. Foster, and unless the grand jury make a formal request for an investigation there is little likelihood of the grand jury taking up the matter at the special meeting to be held on Tuesday morning.

The specific object of the meeting, according to the foreman, is the appointment of routine committee, which have not yet been named, owing to the general criminal business, although the meeting will only a month or so ago.

Chief Beavers stated his position at the special meeting, saying that if he had any individual in mind, he would bring the matter up before the grand jury, but that an investigation will be inaugurated, he said, if Chief Beavers or Chief N. A. LaFollet request a probe of him as foreman of the jury.

In a late hour Monday Chief Beavers did not meet Solicitor Donnelly at 10 o'clock. The chief stated that he had not seen Donnelly since Monday, but that he would certainly take the matter up at the work.

It is said to be improbable that any action will be made by the police against Colonel Foster on the charges against him. The grand jury will probably take a vote of a grand jury against the charges against the colonel, Foster, and grand jury will embody a report upon the matter in the proceedings of the grand jury at the court early in July.

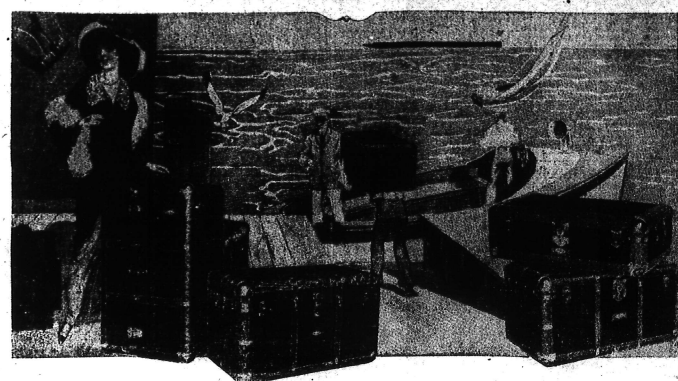
