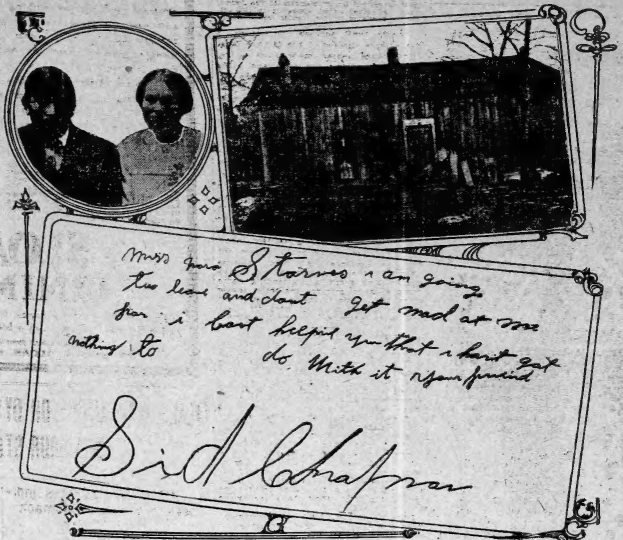

## Poultry Buildings

WHEN chickens are kept from insects and kept in a very comfortable building they will produce eggs during the entire winter months at a time when they are usually high, and that is the time when people want their fowls to do their best.

The demonstration agents of the United States government are now showing, with moving picture films, different styles of poultry houses, and in many states their demonstrators are constantly at work showing the convenient cheap styles of houses, also brooder groups and different methods of feeding. Much valuable work is being done by the government in this respect. It is time to come it will play an important part in the production of both fowls and eggs.

Many people are enabled now to raise a large percent of the little chicks before they are needed. Hundreds of people are more apt to keep chickens that would not think of doing so before the war.

One good house built in a community makes a model pattern that is usually copied by many others, and especially if a person gets results from this house does it encourage others to use one of the same pattern.

Of course keeping chickens on a large scale is a different type of operation, but I think what is wanted now is the cheap building suited to the needs of the average farmer and the average city dweller. It is surprising now in riding over the country to see how many more people are paying attention to their fowls and getting results now when they did not get an idea of it before.

With the various poultry shows and fairs bringing before the public so many popular and profitable varieties of fowls and live stock it is not surprising that the average city dweller would not get an idea of what he is suited to their wants.

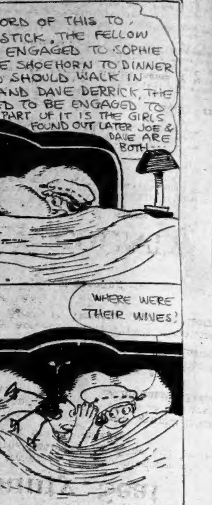
