HEAVY GERMAN GUN SMASHED BY BRITISH

Enormous Weapon Wrecked
While Being Placed In
Position on Hill

(By Associated Press.)
ST. OMER, France, Jan. 25.—(Via Paris, Jan. 25.)—The heavy artillery of the British has destroyed an enormous gun the Germans were placing on a hill about a mile beyond their first line of trenches and about two miles from Ypres, with the object of silencing the English howitzers and bombarding Belgium.

The position of the big gun was marked by a British aviator and the fourth shell from the British guns demolished it.

The British planes then directed their fire on a group of German aviators engaged in placing a similar gun a mile further behind, scattering them with a few well-timed shots. They also smashed three pumps brought up by the Germans to empty water out of their trenches.

NEGROES MADE BUSINESS OF STEALING UMBRELLAS

One of Three Arrested by Police
Makes Confession to Recorder

According to the testimony of Julius Jackson he and two other negroes, Jess Oliver and Oscar Hill, were passing a small fortune in stolen umbrellas until the Atlanta police force made them come in out of the rain Monday.

Julius turned state's evidence before the recorder Tuesday, declaring that his "umbrella gang" had made a practice during the rains of the last few weeks of removing umbrellas from the stands in front of the downtown stores; then selling them to the highest bidder. Profits were large, perils small, he stated.

Recorder Johnson fined Julius five days in consideration of his truthfulness. Oliver and Hill got 15 and thirty days, respectively.

DUKE DE LORGE LOSES HIS LIFE IN BATTLE

PARIS, Jan. 25.—The Duke de Lorge, head of the Durfort-Civrac family, was killed in battle January 23, according to announcement here today. He was struck in the head by one of the shells. The duke, who was twenty-five years old, was serving as a sub-lieutenant in the Thirty-second dragons.

The Duke de Lorge succeeded to the title and the estates a little over two years ago when his father was killed in London by a fall down an elevator shaft.

GOVERNOR OFFERS \$100 REWARD FOR YOUNG BOY

Dewey Henderson, Aged 16
Years, Wanted for Killing
Homer Thompson

Governor Slaton has offered a reward of \$100 for the arrest of Dewey Henderson, aged sixteen years, who stabbed and killed Homer Thompson, a boy about the same age, last November. The stabbing occurred at Whitaker Mills, on the Chattahoochee river, on November 17. The boys had been in a quarrel. Henderson, it is charged, walked up on Thompson while he was getting a drink of water, and stabbed him in the back. Thompson died November 18.

Henderson is described as slender, weight about 115 pounds, light hair, blue eyes and fair complexion.

He has been indicted by the grand jury of Fulton county and is wanted by the sheriff.
