



In spite of the fact that thousands every year are taking up golf, tennis and other games, the new fans have had added also the rush of all the more natural sports—the old game of polo, which, believe it or not, each magnate is making a million dollars. The magnate believes the player is being overpaid and is raking in all the surplus kale. It was only natural that a mix-up should occur, and readjustment is now under way as a result of the arrival of a score of new clubs which are to be arranged in the proper way. All that is necessary is that the readjustment be made as quickly as possible and the tangle be unraveled without too many a delay. But don't get it into your head that interest in sport is waning. It is only at the expense of some men who once had the great benefit to be obtained by a close interest in some good game in a life member.
