Farms as City Builders

"Every farm is a factory, and in every county of the South there are hundreds of these factories which need our best thought and effort to make them more productive.

Owing to British reticence on such matters, there are no authentic reports as to the number of submarines that have been destroyed or the means employed most effectively against them.

It has been suggested that Germany's willingness to yield to American demands in the matter of submarine operations may have been prompted in part by her recognition that her submarine campaign was costing more than it was worth.

Politics and National Defense

This, however, is not the important thing to be considered. The important thing is to develop the national defense independently of party advantage.

"If I were disposed to make political capital out of the fact that the navy is not as strong as it should be, it would be easy to say: 'If there is lack of preparedness, the fault lies at the door of the party that has been in full control for many years.'"

This attitude, as the New York World well says, is "the attitude of true patriotism." The cause of national defense will not be helped but rather hindered by degrading it to a level of narrow, selfish politics.

Our Strength in Munitions.

Commenting on the Government's report that private munition factories in the United States have increased their capacity a thousand per cent and are steadily multiplying their output, the Augusta Chronicle aptly remarks:

"In ammunition at least, it will be easy for the army and navy to obtain what additional supplies they need for any emergency, with little delay. It is the same with regard to rifles and machine guns. The manufacture of field guns is a slower process, and our need of them to round out a proper artillery equipment for a good-sized army is very great."
