A Victory for Bird Protection.

A VICTORY OF BIRLY INCELLEDIA.

It is a matter of keen satisfaction to overyone who realizes the importance of protecting bird life that the Senate Democratic caucus has restored to the tariff bill a clause problikting the importation of feathers and plumage from certain valuable species of vilid birds. This means that the Dirted States will set the world a timely and wholesome example which other nations will doubtress follow and which other nations will doubtress follow and which will go far toward putting an end to a costly and

will go far toward putting an end to a coulty and crust traffic.

The tariff bill, as originally passed by the House, contained a provision that virtually closed American ports to shipments of feathers and plumage intended for commercial uses. This clause was inserted largely through the influence of Adulbon societies and conservationists and it won the ready assent of thoughtful Congressmen, irrespective of party alignments. In the Senato, however, there developed matter a remarkable opposition to the bird provision clause so that its passage seemed for a while extremely doubtful. But the friends of the provision railited to its support and brought to bear so strong a pressure of logic and public sentiment that the Senate's approval was finally won.

This is an interesting example of what organized effort for the safeguarding of birds can accomplish; and it also reveals a great awakening on the party of the American people to the importance of this sub-

and it also revenis a great awatening on the part of the American people to the importance of this sub-ject. A decade age such a measure as this would have bad little or no chance in either branch of Con-gress; It would have ben treated with indifference, it not rideale. But when our representatives at Washington receive letters and telegrams and per-sonal visits from people in every part of the country, all unselfably interested and all armed with wellan unsettanty interested and all armed with well-bonsidered, reasonable pleas for the preservation of valuable birds, results inevitably follow. The title levy apriles ostensibly to cotton future alone, but it is a fact universally known that the cotton business cannot be carried on unless the mechant has some means of protecting himself against the continual and often violent fluctuations of the sotton market.

chant has some means of protecting bimself against the continual and often violent fluctuations of the cotton market.

A cotton firm in Georgia, for instance, may sell to American or European spinners cotton to the amount of a hundred thousand balves, subject to delivery through the year in monthly altometis, suited to the purchasers' demands. Fluctuations in the price of cotton are greater than in that of any other commodity. Obviously, no dealer could afford to make a contract anyolving so large an amount of money and exposed to the endless uncertainties of the cotton market without some assurance against ruinous losses. This necessary safeguard is now provided in the cotton exchange through which merchants can buy contracts against their sales with a sufficient margin established between the two to fix a definite profit on their transactions.

It is, therefore, evident that the cotton future contract is absolutely essential to the orderly and profitable conduct of legitimate cotton business. Indeed, it is the very basis of that vast field of interests comprised in the merchandising, the manufacture and even the production of cotton; for without freedom and security in the buying and selling of the purpose of the Clark amendment to the tariff bill is to penalize, if not destroy, contracted for future delivery of cotton. In either ewent, it would be the cotton grower who would bear the brunt of this unjust tax. If a large number of small buyers are driven out of business, there will soon develop a powerful cotton monopoly that can hold both the farmer and the consumer at its mercy. And what a mockery it would be for a bemocratic Congress to place in the very law which is designed to strike the fetters from individual enterprise a prevision that would inevitably foster a new and tyrannous trust: Even if a considerable number of small buyers remained in the market, they would, as we have said, deduct the future-contract tax from the price paid the producer. The merchant and the manufacturer would be sorely inconvenienced, if not deeply injured but the however suffering, the ultimate burden of this tax would fall

suffering, the uttimate burden of this tax would fail upon the Southern farmer. Something must be done, and done promptly, to avert the grave injustice with which all those interests that depend upon the South's greatest crop are threatened. The Democratic causes for the Senate, despite earnest an. logical appeals, has declined to reconsider its approval of the Clark amendment, so that the tariff will will doubtless pass the Senate unrelieved of this dangerous provision. There thus remain hope and opportunity for freeing an otherwise magnificient work of legislation from this disgraceful and viclous amendment.

It is earnestly to be hoped that the Democrats of the House will stand mimorably against the tax which, should it be allowed to pass, would bring irreparable hardshly to millions of farmers, and would damage every department of America's cotton interests.
